2. All exhibitors must enter the Stall/ Pen/ Cage Department 19 to reserve a stall/ pen/ cage. Refer to page 10 rule #7 in the General Rules: Exhibits & Exhibitor. Do not change pens without speaking to the Superintendent (s). These pens have been assigned to you. You must have permission from the Superintendent and this change must be made with the Fair Office.

3. No cow/calf pairs in the Champion Drive.

4. Heifers need not be spayed to exhibit in the Youth Market beef Show; however they will be judged as terminal.

5. With the consent of all current dairy exhibitors and superintendents any lactating production cow, under stress due to changes in food, water and/or other conditions shall be released if the exhibitor so wishes, for the benefit of the animals health, at the close of the dairy show on Friday afternoon. (As long as she has been on exhibit from Wednesday through the day of the dairy show.) This applies to lactating production animals only, including any dairy animal fresh during the fair. All other exhibits must stay in place until Sunday morning.

6. In order to show in the Park County Youth Market Shows, animals must be born by the following dates:

1. Calves must be born between January 1st and June 1st and in the member's possession no less than TWO weeks of age.

2. Calves must be identified on Bottle Calf ID sheet and submitted to the County Fair Office by **June 1st**.

3. Calves may be any breed (dairy or beef) or sex, however no bull calves are allowed in Bucket Calf Project.

4. Calves must be bottle or bucket fed once they are in your care, no nursing permitted.

5. Calves MUST be weaned from the bottle/bucket and on feed prior to the Fair.

6. Calves are only eligible to be shown in bottle-bucket calf class and showmanship.

7. Calves may be retained and shown a 2nd year.

8. Calves will be shown together at the Fair but premiums and awards separated between Junior, Intermediate and Senior Levels.

9. Overall awards will be given based on the following criteria: Written records (40%), Oral Interview (40%), General Calf Health (10%), Showmanship (10%).

10. Calf Conformation and quality will NOT be considered.

General Rules:

1. Read all Rules & Regulations on livestock in the General Rules and Youth Show rules. If you have any questions please call the Superintendent.
2. All exhibitors must enter the Stall/ Pen/ Cage Department 19 (Dairy) or 4500 (Meat Goat) to reserve a stall/ pen/ cage. Refer to page 10 rule #7 in the Generals Rules: Exhibits & Exhibitor. Do not change pens without speaking to the Superintendent (s). These pens have been assigned to you. You must have permission from the Superintendent and this change must be made with the Fair Office.
3. Does only will be shown in dairy.
4. All breeds will be shown together by age.
5. Horned animals will not be allowed to show in dairy.
6. All dairy goat exhibitors are expected to wear white clothing when showing.
7. Market Goats are to have their milk teeth in place or may have lost one or both of their milk teeth, but there shall be no evidence of breaking skin or eruption of the two permanent teeth.
8. Market Goats may be disbudded, tipped, polled or shown in their natural horned state.
9. Market Goat exhibitors are allowed to use either halters or collars when showing.
10. Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8 inch of hair or less, at the time of arrival on the fairgrounds, Legs may have hair up to the hock and knee only. Slick shorn goats are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/airbrush or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification."
11. Fitting of the breeding meat goats will be left up to the discretion of the exhibitor, but the animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color.
12. Abuse: The Park County Fair does not condone excessive bracing, slapping or lifting legs of Market Goats in the show ring or while on the grounds.
13. Scrapies: Goat exhibitors at Wyoming Jackpots, County Fairs and State Fair are reminded of the Wyoming Livestock Board's requirement that all sheep and goats exhibited in Wyoming must be individually identified with a USDA -APHIS approved scrapie identification. The only exception to the tag is tattoos.
14. In order to show in the Park County Youth Market Shows, animals must be born by the following dates:

You must have permission from the Superintendent and this change must be made with the Fair Office. Superintendents will assign cages to facilitate judging. Do not change cages! If an exhibitor changes/ moves from their assigned cage they will forfeit their premiums.

3. One (1) entry per class per exhibitor.

4. Classes will be judged per American Standards of Perfection.

5. All single entries must be brought to the table to be judged, with the exception of Young and Mature Trio, Pen of Three (3) and Geese which will be judged in their cage. Each exhibitor is responsible for getting their animal to the table at the time the class is judged.

6. No fowl will be allowed to compete in more than one (1) class or for more than one (1) prize.

7. Exhibitors must provide their own containers for feed and water.

8. Exhibitors must feed, water and clean under their poultry cage by 9:00 a.m. daily or they will forfeit their premiums.

9. Clean Up: Remove containers from the cage and ensure they are disposed of. Remove wood shavings from under the cages and place in the manure dump. If cages are not clean by Sunday, July 30th by 11:00 a.m. the exhibitor will forfeit their premiums

The only exception to the tag requirement is that registered animals may be identified with a registration tattoo and must be accompanied with a photo copy of their current registration papers listing the exhibitor as owner. All sheep must be scrapie tagged regardless of registration status. Sheep not meeting these requirements will not be allowed to enter/ check -in.
7. Show order for Market Lambs classes will begin with White Face, then Speckled Face and concluding with Black Face.
8. In order to show in the Park County Youth Market Shows, animals must be born by the following dates:
Market Sheep—after December 1st of the prior year.
9. The show order for Breeding Sheep classes will be determined by Superintendents on show day to make the best use of time.

2. Eligibility of Fleece: Each fleece must represent not more than twelve (12) months growth, except that in the case of yearling fleeces, sixteen (16) months growth will be allowed.

3. Qualifications: Any fleece entered in competition shall be discriminated against if:

- A. Showing any paint or tar brands (soluble branding fluids permissible)
- B. Showing excessive dung locks or tags
- C. Discolored by excessive moisture
- D. Cotted
- E. Showing a weak staple or break in fiber
- F. Containing excess burns or other vegetable matter
- G. Fleece may be shown no more than once in a fair

4. Preparation of Fleece: Spread out the fleece on a clean table or floor, skin side down, taking care, taking care not to pull or open fleece as it is handled. The fleece will look like a pelt or hide. At this stage, before rolling or tying, remove all heavy tags, stained wool, any foreign matter. Rolling the fleece takes four easy steps:

- A. Begin at one side and loosely fold eight (8) to ten (10) inches of the edge toward the center of the fleece.
- B. Do the same on the other side, but fold toward the center two (2) times—until the twice folded portion lies on top of the first fold.
- C. Fold in the head wool.
- D. Roll the entire fleece from the breach toward the shoulder and long side wool. Place fleece in clear plastic heavy duty garbage bag.

1. Read all rules and regulations on livestock in the General Rules and Youth Show Rules. If you have questions please call the Superintendent.
2. Horse ownership or leasing paperwork must be done by May 1st and turned into the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H office either in Powell or Cody.
3. To participate in Park County Fair, participant must complete safety certification through the 4-H office. Safety certifications must be done before July 1st. They are based on one rider/horse. They are good for succeeding years. However, if a youth obtains a new horse, a new certification is required.
4. Exhibitors wanting a stall must enter Department 19 to reserve stall. This is a multi-day show and the exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning the stall(s) before leaving the grounds. Failure to clean stalls result in loss of premiums.
5. Exhibitors must compete in at least one showmanship class (4-H or FFA).
6. Each horse identified to one (1) rider or handler only. No horses can be shared by members. A youth may show in both FFA and 4-H, with different horses.
7. Each member is allowed to show 1 horse per class, and exhibitors can show 2 horses in speed events classes.
8. When needed, exhibitors can receive assistance from leaders, parents, and other members, but exhibitor must be actively participating.
9. Only members enrolled and safety certified can ride their horse at fair. No adults, no other members, no one but youth enrolled with horse is allowed to ride it on grounds during the fair show.
10. Hats, boots, and long sleeve shirts must be worn by all exhibitors. FFA members are required to wear official dress for showmanship. Exhibitor's assigned number must be worn on their person or their saddle pad during all classes. Wearing the wrong number can result in class disqualification.
11. Do Not Lope/Gallop on gravel roads or parking lot, no riding double, bareback riding.
12. Absolutely no mistreatment of horses will be allowed on grounds
13. All contestants will need to adhere to the code of conduct printed in the front of this book. Any contestant that is observed breaking this code of conduct can be asked to leave by the superintendent, Event Employee, or Fair Advisory Board Member.
14. The Park County Fair Management, The Fair Advisory Board, and Superintendents reserve the right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard to and arising from these rules, and matters not covered by these rules
15. No horses under a year of age are allowed at Park County Fair, (a year by AQHA rules).
16. Contestants will have (3) calls to enter the ring, after that they will be automatically scratched from the class. No classes will be delayed for any reason. Ample time will be given for competitors to prepare for classes.
17. We will follow the AQHA rule book for legal tack and class rules. The rules book can be found on the AQHA website. Your Superintendent will also have a print copy of the rule book. Final decisions on rules in the ring will be decided by the judge.

4. 4-H animals will be shown by 4-H members and FFA animals will be shown by FFA members. This will be supervised by an adult at each species.

5. Members must show the animal which they won with in Showmanship and trade with other year contestants at the direction of the judges. Exceptions must be in written form by a vet and/ or species Superintendent.

6. The first and second place winners in each division will compete in the Large Animal Round Robin Showmanship contest. Any contestant winning first or second premiums in more than one (1) of the showmanship classes will elect which species of animal he/ she will show in the Round Robin Showmanship contest. The next contestant will represent that species in the Large Animal Round Robin Showmanship contest.

7. No boars, stallions, dairy bulls, beef bulls or bucks (dairy goats) will be allowed in any showmanship event. Rams (sheep) can be shown.
