General Rules:

1. All flowers & plants should be entered (registered) for the Fair no later than 5 pm on July 1st.
2. Unless otherwise stated, all flowers exhibited must have been grown by the exhibitor.
3. Vases considered in judging in the Artistic Arrangement only.
4. Cut flowers must be shown with foliage, if naturally attached to specimen. Remove leaves that would be under water. No leaf dressing of any kind is acceptable.
5. Gladiolus must be in large heavy containers.
6. Make stems in proportion to flowers/containers. No Styrofoam or plastic cups allowed as vases
7. Please do not bring valuable containers as we cannot be responsible for theft or breakage.
8. Please do not bring anything that has been raised in a commercial green house, it will be disqualified. This does not include spring bedding plants.
9. The same potted plants can only be entered every other year.
10. The superintendent shall have the right to remove from the display, at any time, exhibits which become unsightly.
11. Youth are age 16 and under (age as of Jan. 1st.)

Artistic Arrangement

Divisions 601- 602

1. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used. Accessories may be used in all classes.
2. All designs must contain some plant materials. Plant material need not be grown by exhibitor, but preference will be given to materials grown in Wyoming.
3. Dried materials may be treated, dyed or contrived.
4. No restriction on size or outline UNLESS SPECIFIED.
5. Fresh cut arrangements must be prepared to last duration of Fair.

DIVISION 601 - Adult**DIVISION 602 - Youth****CLASS**

- 1 Holidays: Fresh Flowers and Foliage with other objects
- 2 Water Arrangement: Must contain fresh materials and flowers – to suggest or incorporate water
- 3 Extreme: A large, dramatic arrangement, over 30 inches in height, depth or width
- 4 Centerpiece: To be viewed from all sides; 12 inches or less in height
- 5 Fair Theme: Flowers and/ or other plant material
- 6 Miniature Arrangement: Not over 4 inches
- 7 Dry Arrangement: Natural growth only, spray color per mitted
- 8 Any Other, not listed
- 9 For Youth Only – Centerpiece; To be viewed from all sides; 12 inches or less in height
